GRANT OF EASEMENT

County of Schenectady, having an address at 620 State Street, Schenectady, New York 12305 (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor"), is the owner of that certain parcel of real property commonly known as Airport Road and Habel Lane located in the Town of Glenville, County of Schenectady in the State of New York, identified on the tax maps of the County of Schenectady, as Section 22/Block 1/Lot 10.811 (SBL# 22.-1-10.811) and as Section 22/Block 1/Lot 14 (SBL# 22.-1-14) and pursuant to that certain deed recorded with the County Clerk of the County of Schenectady in Liber1588 at Page 276 and in Liber 1460 at Page 81 (the "Grantor's Land"), and Grantor, for consideration in the amount of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable considerations, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, hereby grants to NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION, a New York corporation, having an address at 300 Eric Boulevard West, Syracuse, New York 13202 and VERIZON New York, Inc. having an address at 140 West Street, New York, NY 10007 (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Grantees"), for Grantees and theirs lessees, licensees, successors, and assigns a perpetual and nonexclusive easement and right of way through, over, across, under and upon the Grantor's Land (the "Easement") under the following terms and conditions.

<u>Section 1</u> - <u>Description of the Easement</u>. The Easement provides the Grantees with the right, privilege, and authority to:

- a. construct, reconstruct, relocate, extend, repair, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, and, at their pleasure, abandon or remove underground electric facilities including a line or lines of wires or cables (either direct-buried or installed in underground conduits), handholes, manholes, conduit, vaults, junction boxes, pad-mount transformers, housings, connectors, switches and switching equipment, pipes, pedestals, closures, ducts and duct work, markers, cables, connections to overhead and underground wires, together with any poles or lines of poles, supporting structures, cables, crossarms, overhead and underground wires, guys, guy stubs, insulators, transformers, braces, fittings, foundations, anchors, lateral service lines, communications facilities, and other fixtures and appurtenances (collectively, the "Facilities"), which the Grantees shall require now and from time to time, for the transmission and distribution of high and low voltage electric current and for the transmission of intelligence and communication data, by any means, whether now existing or hereafter devised, for public or private use, in, through, upon, over, under, and across that portion of the Grantor's Land described in Section 2 below (the "Easement Area"), and the highways abutting or running through the Grantor's Land, and to renew, replace, add to, and otherwise change the Facilities and each and every part thereof and the location thereof within the Easement Area, and utilize the Facilities within the Easement Area for the purpose of providing service to the Grantor and others; and
- b. from time to time, without further payment therefor, to clear the Easement Area of obstructions or structures, and clear and keep cleared the Easement Area by physical and/or mechanical means, of any and all brush, trees, limbs, branches, roots, vegetation, or other obstructions; and
- c. from time to time, without further payment therefor, to clear and keep cleared by physical and/or mechanical means, the Grantor's Land beyond the bounds of the Easement Area, of any and all trees, limbs, branches, roots or vegetation that, in the sole judgment of the Grantees, due to species or structural defects or their tall growing nature, are likely to fall into or encroach upon the Easement Area or interfere in any way with the safe and reliable operation of Grantees' existing or proposed Facilities; and
- d. pass and repass on foot and with vehicles and equipment, along, over, across and upon the Easement Area and the Grantor's Land in order to access the Easement Area and construct, reconstruct, relocate, use, and maintain roads, paths, causeways, and ways of access to and from the Easement Area as is reasonable and necessary in order to exercise to the fullest extent the Easement.
- Section 2 Location of the Easement Area. The "Easement Area" shall consist of a portion of the Grantor's Land twenty (20) feet in width throughout its extent, the centerline of the Easement Area being the centerline of the Facilities. The general location of the Easement Area is shown on the sketch entitled, "Easement Sketch-Exhibit A, WR# 30642890", which sketch is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A" and to be recorded herewith. The final and definitive location(s) of the Easement Area shall become established by and upon the final installation and erection of the Facilities by the Grantees in substantial compliance with Exhibit "A.
- <u>Section 3</u> <u>Facilities Ownership</u>. It is agreed that the Facilities shall remain the property of the Grantees, their successors and assigns.
- Section 4 General Provisions. The Grantor, for itself, its heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees with the Grantees that no act will be permitted within the Easement Area which is inconsistent with the Easement hereby granted; no buildings or structures, or replacements thereof or additions thereto, swimming pools, or obstructions will be erected or constructed above or below grade within the Easement Area; no trees shall be grown, cultivated, or harvested, and no excavating, mining, or blasting shall be undertaken within the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Grantees, it being the intent that the Easement herein conveyed is intended to prohibit the longitudinal or parallel


use or occupancy of said Easement Area by surface or subsurface activities or structures which might damage or interfere with the Facilities; the Easement shall not be modified nor the Easement Area relocated by the Grantor without the Grantees' prior written consent; the present grade or ground level of the Easement Area will not be changed by excavation or filling; the Grantees shall quietly enjoy the Grantor's Land; and the Grantor will forever warrant title to the Grantor's Land.

The Grantees, their successors and assigns, are hereby expressly given and granted the right to assign this Easement, or any part thereof, or interest therein, and the same shall be divisible between or among two or more owners, as to any right or rights created hereunder, so that each assignee or owner shall have the full right, privilege, and authority herein granted, to be owned and enjoyed either in common or severally. This Grant of Easement shall at all times be deemed to be and shall be a continuing covenant running with the Grantor's Land and shall inure to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, legal representatives, and assigns of the parties named in this Grant of Easement.

RE: Revised 2022-23 SUNY Schenectady Operating Budget

In June of 2022, the SUNY Schenectady Board of Trustees approved a Fiscal Year 2022-23 Operating Budget in the amount of \$29,432,318 that included significant funding from the Federally supported American Rescue Plan (ARP).

The College's preliminary budget and application of ARP funding to the revenue model was shared with SUNY in late Spring of 2022 with no concerns. Upon SUNY's review of the final budget in August/September, concerns were raised with the impact of ARP funding on SUNY's chargeback rate formula. As a result, SUNY requested the removal of ARP funding from the Chargeback calculation which resulted in a reduction in projected FY 2022-23 revenues.

As a result of the reduction in revenues, the College proposes a revised 2022-23 Operating Budget in the amount of \$28,513,578 which includes the use of an additional \$645,079 in ARP funding; consisting of unused 2021-22 HEERF funding and \$378,920 in new Supplemental Support ARP (SSARP) funding received by the College in July of 2022. On the expenditure side of the budget, the College proposes a reduction of Employee Benefit costs in the amount of \$918,740 which represents the projected increase in employee benefits budgeted last Spring due to uncertain economic conditions. The revised budget also proposes a reduction in the use of the fund balance from \$2,473,187 to \$2,349,289.

The SUNY Schenectady Board of Trustees approved this revised budget at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 21, 2022. A copy of the revised 2022-23 Operating Budget is attached to this resolution for consideration.

REVISED OPERATING BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1, 2022 AND ENDING AUGUST 31, 2023

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees approved a Fiscal Year 2022-23 College Operating Budget, along with appropriate background information for the items contained in the budget for the period September 1, 2022 to August 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the State University of New York (SUNY) requested changes to the application of Federal HEERF lost revenue funding to the College's 2022-23 Operating Budget formula; resulting in a reduction in the out of County Chargeback rate; and

WHEREAS, the change in Chargeback rate resulted in a reduction of projected revenues requiring an adjustment in projected 2022-23 Operating Budget expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the College received in July 2022 Supplemental Support under the American Rescue Plan (SSARP) and is able to apply \$1,549,528 in SSARP and HEERF funding to the 2022-23 Operating Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Operating Budget can be reduced by \$918,740 in projected Employee Benefits savings due to re-projection of costs; and

WHEREAS, planned use of the Fund Balance for 2022-23 will be reduced from \$2,473,187 to \$2,349,289; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has reviewed the revised budget and found it to be satisfactory; it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the revised operating budget for fiscal year 2022-2023, beginning September 1, 2022 and ending August 31, 2023, be approved in the amount of \$28,513,578; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the President shall be directed to submit the revised budget, together with appropriate documents, to Schenectady County and the State University of New York, in that order, for approval.

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2022-23 REVISED BUDGET OVERVIEW

The revised operating budget is \$28,513,578 for the 2022-23 academic year. This is a increase of \$1,032,469 from the 2021-22 budget.

REVENUES

- Part-time tuition will increase \$4 per credit to \$196 per credit hour. The tuition increase is 2.3% For full-time students the tuition amount is \$2,352 per semester and \$4,704 per academic year. This would still leave SUNY Schenectady with one of the lowest tuition rates of 30 SUNY community colleges.
- The \$15 per credit on-line course fee was eliminated in 2022-23.
- The technology fee increased to \$29 per credit to offset elimination of the on-line course fee. For 2022-23, the technology fee will be \$29 per credit or \$348 full time per semester
- The transportation fee will remain \$10 per credit hour and \$82 per full time student per semester. This fee funds the cost of the student CDTA bus pass benefit, parking at Center City, and a portion of our Security costs.
- The use of fund balance will be \$2,349,289. The college will use \$1,549,528 in Federal HEERF lost revenue funding during 2022-23.
- For State aid, the Budget reflects the equivalent base-aid amount received in 2021-22 with adjustments of \$327,043 for rental aid and \$94,000 for enrollment assistance. Base aid for 2022-23 is due to the one-year "floor" established by the State Legislature to assist community colleges with the current enrollment situation. For 2022-23, State aid increased \$89,625.
- The operating chargeback rate will increase from the current \$2,640 to \$4,000 per out-of-county FTE. Chargeback revenue will increase by \$1,272,618 from the 2021-22 budget.
- The County contribution will increase by 2% or \$48,215; or \$2,458,955 total.

Rent increased during 2022 due to the SLTC paying the portion of rent typically paid by Schenectady County and Schenectady County Social Services. The portion paid by Schenectady County DSS was \$471.56 per month. This is now distributed with increases in NY Connects rent expenditures from \$117.69 to \$235.58; IIIB rent expenditures from \$291.16 to \$409.05; EISEP rent expenditures from \$352.97 to \$470.86, and IIIE rent expenditures from \$471.10 to \$588.99 per month. In addition, we allocated \$2158.24 of CSE funding to pay 12.73% of our rent expenditures or \$179.85, typically paid by Schenectady County.

Schenectady County Public Health Services (SCPHS) has been awarded a grant from the New York State Department of Health in the amount of \$512,300.00 annually to prevent Childhood Lead Poisoning which combines the previous LPPP (intervention) and CLPPPP (primary prevention) programs. In conjunction with these funds, the actionable blood lead level has been reduced.

This program supports education, screening, inspection, and remediation of lead hazards within homes in the City of Schenectady and care coordination, environmental management, and screening of daily blood lead levels of children within Schenectady County. Environmental Health staff also work directly with homeowners/landlords to remediate hazards to ensure the home is lead safe while working with other community organizations such as City Codes, Section 8, and local health care providers. Given the increased workload associated with increased caseloads, additional staff will be required to perform these activities.

IDENTIFICATION OF PARTIES TO THE CONTRACT

- PURCHASER The Purchaser is The County of Schenectady, a municipal corporation, В. organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with an office for the transaction of business at 620 State Street, Schenectady, NY 12305.

PROPERTY TO BE SOLD

The property which the Seller is agreeing to sell and which the Purchaser is agreeing to purchase land located in the City of Schenectady, County of Schenectady, State of New York, known as 2 Shirley Drive, and more particularly described as Section, Block and Lot of 60.56-1-14.

PURCHASE PRICE

The total purchase price is One Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$150,000) DOLLARS The Purchaser shall pay the purchase price as follows:

I am requesting approval to enter a professional services contract with UHY- LLP for the independent audit of the 2022 and 2023 Financial Statements of the County and the Glendale Home as outlined below. UHY has agreed to perform these audit services at the following annual rates:

County Government:

General Purpose Financial Statement Audit: \$57,500

Federal Single Audit: \$16,000

New York State Single Audit \$4,750

Subtotal: \$78,250

Glendale Home:

Financial Statements: \$29,500

New York State Medicaid Cost Report: \$4,750

Federal Single Audit (pandemic funds) \$7,000

Subtotal: \$41,250

*Total Fee: \$119,500

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* Note that the Federal Single Audit for the Glendale home was triggered in 2021 by the increase in federal funds received for pandemic-related funding. UHY anticipates this requirement again for the fiscal year 2022 audit (2023 audit is yet to be determined).

The 2023 Adopted Budget includes adequate funding in both the County Auditor's Office and Glendale Home budgets to fund these services at the rates above. In addition, the County may consult with UHY on other matters on an as-needed basis, per an agreed upon fee schedule.
