WHEREAS, the County Attorney further advises that the first-year cost of the agreement is \$3,099,266.22 with annual adjustments of the twelve-month average of the Consumer Price Index for the U.S. City Average of Medical Care as published by the U.S. Department of Labor; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager by memorandum dated February 10, 2023 recommends that the County enter into an agreement with Primecare Medical of New York, Inc., Professional Care Medical Practice, P.C., Professional Care Dental Services, P.C., and Personal Care Registered Professional Nursing, P.C. for medical and dental services for incarcerated individuals under the custody of the Schenectady County Sheriff; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County Manager be, and he hereby is authorized, after approval of the County Attorney as to form and content, to negotiate and to execute an agreement with Primecare Medical of New York, Inc., Professional Care Medical Practice, P.C., Professional Care Dental Services, P.C., and Personal Care Registered Professional Nursing, P.C. for services consistent with the provisions of this Resolution.

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Manager further advises that eligible employees can earn up to \$3,000.00 depending upon the number of hours worked and duration of service within the designated vesting periods; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Manager further advises that County staff have reviewed the guidance documents associated with the aforesaid bonus initiative provided by the Department of Health, and have identified appropriate titles and employees who may be eligible for the bonus payment for the period of October 1, 2022 through November 11, 2022; and

WHEREAS, acceptance of these monies and utilization of these funds needs to be reflected in a resolution of this Legislature; now, therefore, be it
