The Position

The Glendale Home is hiring dedicated individuals for the position of Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA). This position exists in the Schenectady County Glendale Nursing Home and involves performance of non-technical tasks involving the routine care of patients and providing such indirect or non-nursing services as are not required to be performed by a Licensed Practical or Registered Professional Nurse.

This position pays \$16.87 plus a shift differential with excellent benefits plus a free meal, coffee and tea for each shift. Full-time and part-time positions are available.

Qualifications

Candidates must possess the following minimum qualifications to be considered:

- A. graduate of a nursing program for Registered Professional or Licensed Practical Nurse approved by the New York State Education Department or by a licensing authority in another state, territory or possession of the U.S. who has taken and passed the New York State Competency Examination; OR
- B. Current listing in the New York State Health Department RHCF Nurse Aide registry; OR
- C. Completion of New York State RHCF Nurses Aide training program and waiting to take competency examinations* or results of such examinations; OR
- D. A certified Nurse Aide currently listed in another state's Nurse Aide Registry who has applied to the State Health Department to obtain state certification; OR
- E. Currently enrolled in a Nurse's Aide training program approved by the New York State Health Department. *
