A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A PUBLIC BENEFIT SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH WEST YARD PROPERTIES, LLC REGARDING A GRANT TO BE USED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ARENA AT MOHAWK HARBOR IN THE CITY OF SCHENECTADY

BE IT ENACTED, by the Legislature of the County of Schenectady, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Attorney by memorandum dated February 8, 2024 recommends that Schenectady County enter into a Public Benefit Services Agreement with West Yard Properties, LLC that would provide for a \$5 million dollar grant to be used for the construction of an events center and sports facility (Arena) at Mohawk Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Attorney advises that the proposed Arena would be 97,000 square feet, and would provide seating of 2,200 for hockey and other athletic events and seating of 3,595 for concerts and special events; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Attorney further advises that the proposed Arena would be the home of Union College's Division One Men's and Women's hockey programs; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Attorney further advises that the Public Benefit Services Agreement provides for a seven-year recapture provision, which helps to ensure that the grantee makes a reasonable effort to utilize the Arena to host at least fifteen events each calendar year for seven calendar years following the issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Attorney further advises that the Arena will serve as a back-up site (during inclement weather) for Schenectady County's "Summer Night," and SUNY Schenectady's Graduation Ceremonies; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager by memorandum dated February 9, 2024 recommends that Schenectady County enter into a Public Benefit Services Agreement with West Yard Properties, LLC that would provide for a \$5 million dollar grant to be used for the construction of an events center and sports facility (Arena) at Mohawk Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager advises that the \$5 million grant to West Yard Properties, LLC will come from American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds received by Schenectady County; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager further advises that the expenditure of these funds received through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 would help bolster economic activity in the Mohawk Harbor area; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Manager be and he hereby is authorized, after approval of the County Attorney as to form and content, to negotiate and to execute a Public Benefit Services Agreement with West Yard Properties, LLC consistent with the provisions of this resolution.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Schenectady County Unified Communications Center by a memorandum dated February 6, 2024 advises that Schenectady County was recently awarded monies from the NYS Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services out of the NYS 2023 Public Safety Answering Point Operations Grant Program, which monies will be used to support eligible public safety call-taking and dispatching expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Schenectady County Unified Communications Center further advises that Schenectady County is projected to receive \$175,333.00 in funding; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the NYS Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services by letter dated October 24, 2023 advises that Schenectady County has been awarded \$175,333.00 under the NYS 2023 Public Safety Answering Point Operations Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Manager by memorandum dated February 9, 2024 recommends the acceptance of monies from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, acceptance of these monies and utilization of these funds needs to be reflected in a resolution of this Legislature; now, therefore, be it

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the County of Schenectady, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Economic Development and Planning by memorandum dated December 15, 2023 advises that Sandy Jackson of Jackson Demolition (Jamrock Leasing, LLC) would like to enter into a multi-year lease agreement with Schenectady County for an approximate one-acre parcel at the Schenectady County Airport; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Economic Development and Planning further advises that Mr. Jackson of Jamrock Leasing, LLS would like to build an approximate 9,600 square foot hangar on the aforesaid parcel; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Economic Development and Planning further advises that the aforesaid lease agreement would be for twenty years (with two five-year options to renew), and the annual rent for the first year would begin at \$12,000.00, and would increase every year thereafter by the consumer price index or 3%, whichever is higher; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Economic Development and Planning further advises that Mr. Jackson of Jamrock Leasing, LLC has agreed to make a payment in lieu of tax payments

(PILOT), and failure to execute such PILOT would nullify the site lease agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Attorney by memorandum dated February 8, 2024 recommends the approval of a multi-year lease agreement between Schenectady County and Jamrock Leasing, LLC for an approximate one-acre parcel at the Schenectady County Airport; and

- 1. Special Deputies shall be compensated at an hourly rate at the highest step of the Correction Officer salary grade;
- 2. Special Deputies are not eligible for hazardous duty pay, meal allowance pay, and longevity pay;
- 3. Special Deputies shall receive 8 hours of vacation and 8 hours of sick leave for every 200 hours worked each year, and they may use up to 16 hours of sick leave as personal leave;
- 4. Special Deputies shall be permitted to accumulate 5 sick days per year up to a maximum of 185 days;
- 5. Special Deputies shall receive in-service training; and

6. Special Deputies shall receive one complete uniform, and a prorated annual uniform allowance based on the Correction Officers annual uniform allowance rate; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager by memorandum dated February 2, 2024 recommends that Schenectady County enter into the aforesaid memorandum of understanding with the Special Deputies' Unit of the Office of the Schenectady County Sheriff, and that the appropriate budgetary amendments be approved; now, therefore, be it
