RESOLUTION 67-24

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING APRIL 2024 AS AUTISM ACTION MONTH

WHEREAS, the prevalence of autism in the United States has risen from 1 in 150 children in the year 2000, to 1 in 36 children based on the latest research from 2023, an increase of 312%, highlighting the urgent need for action; and

WHEREAS, people of all abilities deserve to fully participate in their communities and live fulfilling lives of dignity and respect, including those who are living with the most significant disabilities; and

WHEREAS, April has widely been known as “Autism Awareness Month” in the United States in an effort to educate the public, foster understanding and inclusivity, and shine a light on the systemic barriers people with autism face in their daily lives; and

WHEREAS, we celebrate differences and promote the acceptance of people with autism, emphasizing that individuals with autism and their families deserve the opportunity to thrive; and

WHEREAS, it is crucial that our work doesn’t stop at awareness and acceptance— we recognize the need to advance policies that better provide services and supports for early intervention, education, transition to adulthood, employment, and community living; and

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Legislature honors those with autism and their families and recognizes the need to be aware of, accept, and appreciate the incredible diversity within the autism spectrum, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Schenectady County Legislature proclaims April 2024 as Autism Action Month to help spread further awareness of the realities of autism, promote acceptance in our community, and ignite change to ensure that the universal human rights of all autistic people are respected.

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Manager by memorandum dated April 5, 2024 recommends that the request from the Association of Legal Aid Attorneys – UAW Local 2325 (AFL-CIO) for voluntary recognition of a new bargaining unit be forwarded to this Governing Body; now, therefore, be it

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the County of Schenectady, as follows:

WHEREAS, after negotiations between representatives of the County of Schenectady and 1199 SEIU, agreement has been reached upon the terms of a tentative agreement between the County and the aforesaid union, which commences April 28, 2024 and continues until December 31, 2025 relating to terms and conditions of employment, and which contains the following:

Compensation Increases

1. Provides a 10% salary increase for all non-nursing service employees;
2. Provides a 20% shift differential for all nursing employees who work between the hours of 7:00 am and 3:00 pm (total shift differential and weekend differential shall not exceed 30%);
3. The Temporary Six-Month Increase in the shift differential for the second and third shift outlined in a previous "Pilot Agreement" shall remain in effect; and
4. All unit employees will have their pay lagged by one week, and all affected employees will receive a bonus equal to the amount of one week of pay at the time the lag is implemented;
