RESOLUTION 17-25

Sponsored by Legislator Ostrelich:

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND HONORING THE SCHENECTADY COUNTY FOOD COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Schenectady County Food Council (SCFC) is a collaborative group that unites local farmers, health professionals, business leaders, policymakers, and residents to address food insecurity and advocate for policies and changes that build a strong, healthier, more equitable, sustainable, and community-driven food system in Schenectady County; and

WHEREAS, through community engagement, advocacy, and collaboration, the Schenectady County Food Council strives to ensure a space for identifying community-driven solutions that help cultivate a locally rooted, accessible, nourishing and resilient food system; and

WHEREAS, the SCFC serves a crucial purpose by providing a platform for community members and stakeholders to engage in local food system issues, advocating for policies that improve well-being and accessibility, assessing the effectiveness of the local food system, and promoting community-informed policies and practices; and

WHEREAS, the SCFC is composed of a dedicated fourteen person Steering Committee, three Working Groups that include sixty members, as well as general members who regularly attend Food Council events, embodying the collaborative spirit necessary to address systemic challenges in food security and access; and

WHEREAS, based on insights from the Food & Poverty Speak-Out and feedback from the Community Advocates, the Schenectady County Food Council identified four key advocacy priorities for 2025: increasing the SNAP minimum benefit to \$100, fully funding HPNAP & Nourish New York at \$75 million each, clarifying SNAP eligibility interpretations, and improving SNAP application processing times; and

WHEREAS, in partnership with the Schenectady Foundation, Messiah Lutheran Church, the Rotterdam Community Center, and the Sycamore Collaborative, the Schenectady County Food Council launched a Community Advocates Program, a 10-week course designed to empower residents with lived experience in food insecurity; and

WHEREAS, this program, which concluded in August, provided eleven participants with essential public speaking and advocacy skills, equipping them to become effective voices for their communities, and at the October General Community Gathering, these advocates shared

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powerful testimonies, inspiring attendees, and reinforcing the importance of community-driven advocacy in addressing food insecurity; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the SCFC marks a significant step forward in fostering community-driven solutions and systemic change to ensure equitable access to nourishing food for all residents of Schenectady County; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Schenectady County Legislature recognizes and celebrates the creation of the Schenectady County Food Council and commends its mission and the work is has done to foster a just, equitable, and sustainable food system; and, now therefore be it further

RESOLVED, that the Schenectady County Legislature honors the commitment of the Schenectady County Food Council and its partners to empower residents, address systemic inequities, and inspire collective action for a more nourishing future.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT WITH THE PUBLIC DEFENDER'S UNION, ASSOCIATION OF LEGAL AID ATTORNEYS – UAW LOCAL 2325

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the County of Schenectady, as follows:

WHEREAS, the County Attorney by memorandum dated February 7, 2025 advises that Schenectady County and the Association of Legal Aid Attorneys (UAW Local 2325), representing a new bargaining unit in the Office of the Schenectady County Public Defender, have reached a Tentative Agreement with such employee organization regarding terms and conditions of employment; and

WHEREAS, after extensive negotiations between representatives of the County and said union, a tentative agreement has been reached upon the terms of a collective bargaining agreement commencing January 1, 2025 and ending on December 31, 2027; and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney further advises that the members of the new bargaining unit in the Office of the Schenectady County Public Defender have ratified the Tentative Agreement on February 6, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney further advises that the major provisions that are included in the Tentative Agreement are as follows:

- 1. Pay Increases:
 - a. For calendar year 2025 3% plus \$3,000 in base salary
 - b. For calendar year 2026 3.5%
 - c. For calendar year 2027 3.5%
- 2. Promotional Opportunities

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a. The Tentative Agreement provides for five different promotional opportunities, and each position includes a 10% differential

- 3. Counsel at First Appearance payment
 - a. Each week two members of the bargaining unit are required to be oncall for all necessary court appearances, and the payment for such duty is increased from \$1,000 per week to \$1,650 per week
- 4. Health Care, Disciplinary Procedures, and Vacation and Sick Time
 - a. These items are similar to the provisions in the current CSEA contract

; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager by memorandum dated February 7, 2025 recommends that the County enter into a collective bargaining agreement with the Public Defender's Union, Association of Legal Aid Attorneys (UAW Local; 2325), representing a new bargaining unit in the Office of the Schenectady County Public Defender; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Manager be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a collective bargaining agreement with the Public Defender's Union, Association of Legal Aid Attorneys, Local 2325, subject to the approval of the County Attorney, and consistent with the provisions of this resolution and in accordance with the terms and conditions of employment spelled out in the Tentative Agreement (dated February 6, 2025) between the County and the aforesaid union for the calendar years of 2025, 2026, and 2027, for all county employees in the bargaining unit represented by the aforesaid union.
